
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
8 BAR BLUES SOLO

Welcome to this first lesson in our 3 part mini series on lead guitar playing. We will be covering a HUGE amount, and giving you the fundamentals you need as an intermediate lead guitar player. We kick off with this awesome guitar solo that uses the pentatonic shape 1, 2 & 3 in the key of A minor. In this worksheet we'll learn the solo and the three shapes in detail.

the solo tab


Let's kick off with the solo tab. Note how we break it down into 5 licks and be sure to relate each lick to the correct pentatonic shape. Good luck!
